# STRATEGIC PILLARS

#### LITERACY ENHANCEMENT

.Children and young people in slum communities lack foundational literacy and digital skills due to systemic barriers in access, quality, and learning support. We provide targeted remedial support, age-appropriate learning materials, digital tools, and engaging activities in safe, child-friendly spaces.



## THEORY OF CHANGE

Our Theory of Change outlines the pathway through which we empower marginalized children and young people in slum communities to overcome systemic challenges and lead positive transformation in their lives and communities. Rooted in our five strategic pillars—Literacy Enhancement, Psychosocial Care, Talent Development, Workforce Readiness & Livelihoods, and Child Rights Advocacy—this framework illustrates how targeted interventions lead to skill acquisition, personal growth, and long-term societal impact.

It maps the logical progression from the core problems young people face—such as illiteracy, trauma, invisibility, economic vulnerability, and exclusion—to strategic activities, tangible outputs, measurable outcomes, and ultimately, transformative impact. A key feature of our approach is the deliberate integration of skill sets across all pillars, ensuring that children and youth gain the tools they need to thrive emotionally, creatively, academically, economically, and civically

The final impact envisions <u>empowered, resilient, and self-confident children and young people who are leveraging opportunities, shaping resilient futures, and leading positive transformation in their communities.</u> This Theory of Change serves as both a strategic compass and a tool for accountability, guiding program design, monitoring, evaluation, and learning throughout the strategic period 2024–2029.

# GOALS & OBJECTIVES

### • Achieve foundational literacy for all children in target communities.


- Establish and maintain a library (fixed & mobile) with age-appropriate reading & writing materials.
- Deliver guided literacy sessions to enrolled children and others in the slum communities.
- Incorporate word puzzles and strategy games, such as chess, into guided literacy sessions..

### **b** Enhance digital fluency among children and young people.

- Establish a digital lab with functional computers, internet access, and digital learning resources.
- Train young people in basic digital skills (e.g., using computers, internet & online safety)

### Foster lifelong learning habits among children and young people

- Deliver community-based freewriting and readaloud sessions to enhance writing confidence and literacy engagement
- Collaborate with schools in freewriting and readaloud sessions, leveraging school resources to expand literacy opportunities.

### WHY

### HOW

By using creative, arts-based, and game-based interventions—including music, drama, visual arts, and games to foster healing, emotional expression, & a sense of normalcy

# GOALS & OBJECTIVES

- Support emotional healing through creative and expressive arts.
  - Facilitate structured arts-based healing sessions

     using music, drama, and visual arts—to promote emotional expression and trauma recovery among children and young people.
  - Integrate therapeutic games, such as chess and puzzles, into sessions to enhance emotional regulation, critical thinking, and social connection.
- Strengthen emotional resilience and psychosocial coping skills.
  - Lead peer support circles and group dialogues to help children and youth build empathy, selfawareness, and emotional resilience.
  - Embed psychosocial life skills—such as stress management, conflict resolution, and emotional literacy—into arts and recreational activities.
- Build organizational capacity to deliver expressive arts-based psychosocial support.
  - Train staff & volunteers in trauma-informed expressive arts methodologies, including drama therapy, visual arts, and therapeutic play.
  - Partner with local schools, youth hubs, and NGOs to expand the reach and sustainability of expressive arts healing sessions.





## TALENT DEVELOPMENT

### WHY

Despite their creativity &potential, children and youth in slum communities have few opportunities to explore or develop their artistic talents.

### HOW

We offer training in various creative arts—including music, dance, drama, visual arts, and spoken word—as well as access to tools, and platforms to perform/ exhibit their work.

# GOALS & OBJECTIVES

### Develop artistic skills of children and young people in slum communities

- Establish a creative arts hub equipped with tools, such as musical instruments and art supplies, to provide access for children and young people
- Deliver training in creative arts, such as music, drama, and visual arts to develop artistic skills
- Partner with music organizations to deliver beginner-friendly theory and notation curricula and develop a peer mentorship model

### Develop youth capacity in instrument care, repair, and build

- Train young people in tuning, maintenance, repair and building of musical instruments to reduce external dependency & ensure sustainability.
- Establish a youth-run repair workshop to maintain program instruments and generate income from community services

- Organize community arts festivals to showcase young artists' talents and increase their visibility.
- Collaborate with local media to feature young artists' stories and performances, enhancing community recognition

# GOALS & OBJECTIVES

- **C** Equip young people with marketable, ecoconscious vocational skills
  - Deliver training on handcrafting tyre sandals, handbags, and accessories from recycled materials, to equip young people with marketable skills.
  - Set up a youth-led creative enterprise hub that doubles as a vocational training space and incubation center for micro-businesses.
- Support the creation of sustainable microenterprises
  - Provide seed funding and mentorship to young entrepreneurs to start sustainable microenterprises.
  - Facilitate the formation of group enterprises to generate collective income for young people.
- C Strengthen market access and visibility for youth-led products and services.
  - Develop and maintain a digital marketplace including an e-commerce section on the organization's website—to showcase and sell youth-made eco-products.
  - Participate in local trade fairs, pop-up markets, and exhibitions to increase offline sales &public visibility of youth enterprises.

# GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Empower children and young people to advocate for their rights through digital &creative media

 Train children and young people to create advocacy content using smartphones, video, photo stories, and audio tools to highlight rights violations and solutions.

 Facilitate youth-led digital campaigns and storytelling series to amplify their voices & influence public discourse on child rights.

Raise community awareness and drive collective action for child rights protection

- Deliver rights-focused performances and community events—using music, storytelling, and participatory drama—to engage the community.
- Develop and disseminate child-friendly rights education materials—such as songs, visual guides, skits—tailored for children and caregivers.
- Use National & International Days (e.g., Day of African Child) to stage events on children's rights.

### • Strengthen systems for child participation and protection in slum communities

 Collaborate with local authorities, schools, and CSOs to integrate child participation and protection mechanisms into community structures and policies
